Dear Parents/Guardians,


I hope you have had a fun-filled half term and that you are all refreshed and ready for what the second part of the spring term brings. This half term we will continue with our curriculum theme 'Superheroes'.


Below, there is some information about the school year and some ideas about helping your child at home.

### **Phonics**

Little Egret have been working incredible hard in phonics. We have reassessed them and they will be starting in their new/continued groups this week.

In June this year, Y1 will have their phonics screening check. It would really benefit the children if you could recap the sounds learnt. We will post links to the Virtual Classroom on Seesaw, and in the front of their RWI books you will find a chart containing speed sounds and words related to the books they are reading. Each child will be able to tell you how we practise these (See below for an example).





### Reading

Reading leaders will give each child a Read Write Inc book as well as a book bag book to read at home. These will be changed as we move through the scheme. The children practise their reading with books that match the phonics and the 'tricky words' they know. They start thinking that they can read and this does wonders for their confidence. The children also practise reading (and spelling) what we call 'tricky words', such as 'once,' 'have,' 'said' and 'where'.

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Children should read at home <u>at least five times a week</u>. All reading should be recorded in their Reading Record books, please also write in here any other home reading you might share. If your child reads separately with an adult at school this will be recorded in the Reading Record.



#### Maths

This half term we will be learning about addition and subtraction within 20. We will then move onto place value within 50.

#### Homework

We use **'Seesaw**' as our online learning platform in Little Egret class. I will be uploading a weekly maths activity linked to what we have been learning. This is intended for you to work on together, consolidating the week's learning.

### **Spellings**

Children will have weekly spellings to practise and learn. Each child will have a spelling book in which these weekly spellings can be practised. If your spelling book is full, please let me know and I will provide another one. There are lots of

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different ways to learn their spellings. It is important that they also understand the meaning of the words they are learning. Can they put them into context? Can they write a sentence including one or two?

### <u>PE</u>

PE will be taught on a <u>Monday</u> and <u>Friday</u>. Please ensure your child brings their kit to school at the beginning of the week. This can be left in school for the week. We will also have a shorter PE session on a Friday, they can wear their outdoor learning clothes, however, please ensure they have their trainers with them.

### **Outdoor Learning**

This term outdoor learning will take place on <u>Fridays</u>. We plan to be outside whatever the weather!

- Each child to keep a pair of wellies in a named bag in school.
- Children to wear suitable clothes for outdoor learning (eg clothes you will not mind coming home muddy!). **Their school jumper should still be worn.**

### Other Information:

We are a healthy eating school so children should bring in a healthy tuck for breaktimes eg cereal bars - no chocolate, fruit, chopped vegetables, plain or savoury rice cakes. Crisps, chocolate bars, marshmallow Krispie bars, etc should be kept for lunch boxes. We encourage children to have a water bottle in school, so they have access to water (water only) throughout the day. Water bottles should be labelled with your child's name.
