Dear Parents/Guardians,

Welcome back to school. I hope you had a relaxing half term break and are now ready for more learning and adventures as we lead up to Christmas.

We continue with our curriculum theme of 'Childhood'. We continue to learn about childhood in the 1950s, starting with the coronation of Queen Elizabeth. In a few weeks we move away from our history focus. We will be exploring 'Our Wonderful World'.

In the Our Wonderful World project, your child will learn the meaning of the terms geography, physical feature and human feature. They will use maps, including picture maps, globes, online mapping tools and world maps. Your child will learn to use positional language, such as next to and behind, and directional language, such as forwards and backwards. They will also become familiar with the cardinal compass points, north, south, east and west. They will learn the names and positions of the continents and oceans of the world and they will study aerial photographs and spot familiar areas of their locality from above.

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Phonics

Kittiwake have been working hard in phonics. We have reassessed them and they will be starting in their new/continued groups after the holidays.

This half term Y2 will be undertaking the phonics screening check. I intend to administer the tests in December, which I hope will give them all another 5 weeks of practising. If they do not pass this time, they will retake the test in the Summer term.

In June 2022, Y1 have their phonics screening check.

Please continue to recap all their sounds as regularly as you can. It really is the foundation to becoming fluent readers and writers.

Reading

Reading leaders will give each child a Read Write Inc book as well as a book bag book to read at home. These will be changed as we move through the scheme. The children practise their reading with books that match the phonics and the 'tricky words' they know. They start thinking that they *can* read and this does wonders for their confidence. The children also practise reading (and spelling) what we call 'tricky words', such as 'once,' 'have,' 'said' and 'where'.

Children should read at home <u>at least five times a week</u>. All reading should be recorded in their Reading Record books, please also write in here any other home reading you might share.



Maths

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<u>Y1</u>

This half term we are learning all about 'Addition and Subtraction'. We will be using the part-whole model to add, learning our number bonds to 10, comparing number bonds, learning about the subtraction operation and counting on and back.

<u>Y2</u>


